We took him to a specialist where he was diagnosed with Masticatory Muscle Myositis and were informed that his prognosis wasn't good. The doctor said we could try steroids to see if he could get more movement in his jaw, but not to get our hopes up. But Tonka isn't named after a sturdy truck for nothing! After lots of love and TLC from his amazing foster mama, Tonka started to be able to open his mouth a little bit! And then a little more! And a little more! The Hail Mary steroids were working! Today, Tonka can open his mouth about 3 inches and is about to be weaned off the steroids completely, which is the final test to see if he will continue to improve on his own. But that's not the only good news! Tonka has moved in with his wonderful foster to adopt family and even has a doggie sister! Thanks to lots of love and care and faith, he can be a normal dog again, loved for years to come.
